Information: Simple requests for information like phone numbers, addresses, hours of operation, etc.

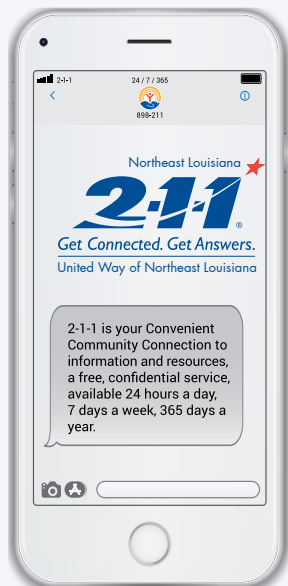
Referrals: 2-1-1 staff will assess your needs to connect you to appropriate, available services
