Increasing local graduation rates

READ.LEARN.SUCCEED.: Improving Reading Skills Since 2012

Studies show that students who cannot read on grade level by the end of the 3rd grade are four times less likely to graduate from high school than a child who can, so United Way of Northeast Louisiana has partnered with Lincoln Parish, Monroe City, Ouachita Parish, and Union Parish School Districts to tackle this issue.

Launched during the 2012-2013 school year, **READ.LEARN.SUCCEED.**, United Way of Northeast Louisiana's community education initiative, focuses on helping 2nd and 3rd graders read on grade level, with the ultimate goal of improving local graduation rates.

Since its launch, **READ.LEARN.SUCCEED.** has helped over 900 Northeast Louisiana students improve their reading skills, increasing their chances of graduating from high school. The initiative has also provided over 24,000 free books to **READ. LEARN.SUCCEED.** students to add to their home libraries, helping to inspire a life-long love of reading.



United Way of Northeast Louisiana has partnered with **FamilyWize** to provide free prescription savings for everyone in our community. Whether insured or uninsured, **FamilyWize** can help save on prescription medication. The app is free to download and is accepted at over 60,000 pharmacies nationwide.

Dollars & \$ense Reality Fair: Providing A Sound Financial Education for Area Teens

The United Way of Northeast Louisiana **Dollars & Sense Reality Fair** is a financial education simulation during which high school students actively learn how to make better financial decisions and gain knowledge of budgeting, saving, and spending.



Upon completion of the **Dollars & Sense Reality Fair**, students have increased understanding of the source and uses of their income, while beginning to develop responsible attitudes towards budgeting, spending and saving. A follow-up curriculum

developed by the University of Louisiana at Monroe is also offered upon completion of the simulation to further enrich students' learning.

Long Term Recovery: Working Together To Help People Recover from 2016 Flooding

United Way of Northeast Louisiana facilitates the Northeast Louisiana Long Term Recovery Group, a diverse group of community partners. The Long Term Recovery Group's goal is to address unmet needs of the most vulnerable individuals and families, such as low income elderly and disabled residents, impacted by the March 2016 flooding, helping them return home and resume the routine of daily life activities.

The Northeast Louisiana Long Term Recovery Group Unmet Needs Committee meets weekly. Represented by the American Red Cross, ARCO, Catholic Charities, Children's Coalition, United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), Waking Up, Inc., and community volunteers, and facilitated and staffed by United Way of Northeast Louisiana, as of April 2017, the Long Term Recovery Committee has helped 93 local families with \$111,753 to provide household goods, housing, reconstruction expenses, and other vital needs, enabling them to return to their homes.
